Scripture: Exodus 20:15

Going Deeper:

- In her book, *Ten Words To Live By*, Jen Wilkin defines stealing as "...gain at someone else's unwilling expense." How does that definition apply to situations other than taking someone else's tangible property?
- In <u>Luke 16:10–12</u>, Jesus taught that our faithfulness in the small things in life is very important. When we are found faithful in small things, we can be trusted with greater things. How are you tempted to justify small compromises you are faced with in your daily life? How do small acts of deceit make you more comfortable with bigger compromises?
- Pastor David shared that faithful stewardship is a sign of trust in God's provision and always leads us to give generously. Describe how you are encouraged by working and sharing God's provision with others.
