Sermon Title: The Tenth Commandment: The Desires Of The Heart **Scripture: Exodus 20:17**

This week, Pastor David completed the sermon series on The Ten Commandments with a look at the 10th Commandment.

- 1. The Disordered Desires Of Our Heart
- 2. Our Hope In The Face Of Our Disordered Desires

Going Deeper:

- The 10th Commandment is different than the commandments that precede it. This one is internal, and no one but God knows when you break it. How does this make obedience more challenging?
- Pastor David shared that, since the Fall, the desires of our heart have been disordered.
 More often than we want to admit, we desire the wrong thing, the wrong way, at the
 wrong time, and for the wrong reason. In what way(s) have your desires been
 disordered?
- The antidote to our disordered desires is contentment. Pastor David shared two practical steps to learning contentment: cultivating godliness and gratitude. What changes do you need to make to cultivate contentment in your life?
