Sermon Title: The Return of the King

Scripture: Mark 11:1–18

This week, Pastor David shared how Jesus' cursing of the fig tree and cleansing of the temple were connected. His main points were:

- A Relationship with Jesus produces a changed life
- A Relationship with Jesus provides access to God's saving work

Going Deeper:

- Pastor David shared that, as a follower of Jesus, change is our destiny: the Holy Spirit is transforming us to be more like Jesus. How do you see this change occurring in your life?
- The fig tree is part of the larger story of the Old Testament and, as Jesus explains it, is a living parable. How can a person be active/busy for Jesus without developing intimacy with Him?
- In verses 15–18, we see why the religious leaders wanted to crucify Jesus. He was proclaiming that, through Him, both Jews and Gentiles could have access to the Father. Why was that such a threatening message?
- How can you show the fruit of the Spirit-love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, gentleness, faithfulness, and self-control-in your workplace, in your neighborhood, and in your family?
- What are the tables Jesus needs to turn over in your life so that you can love Him more deeply and follow him more closely?

Additional Discovery:

When I would gather them, declares the LORD, there are no grapes on the vine, nor figs on the fig tree; even the leaves are withered, and what I gave them has passed away from them."
